Of these ten grew to menhood and womenhood and raised families. I have very complete records of six of these families and incomplete records of two others. Your grandmother, Many Cornella Locey was the youngest of these children. She was born in 1825, so was only a year old when the family moved from New York to Carlisle. The interesting thing is that your grandfather Jesse Miles was my father's uncle and your grandmother, Cornelia was my mother's punt, so we are all double cousins.

I have been able to get some of the femily records through my Roberts relatives in Crent Courty, Wisconsin, and some of them through your cousin, Mrs. Nachol Auldridge, of Tacome, Washington.

Was. Ide Corres, who lives at Innester Wisconsin, maye me the names and some of the detes of the members of the Miles femily, but see did not have the names of the grandchild-or and their families. Thus, Auddridge gave me the complete record of the family of Esther Miles Branscombe.

You spoke of your Aunt Keziah. I had word from Wisconsin a short time ago that she passed away in January and is buried at Long Beach. Do you know her maiden name and the date and place of her marriage to your Uncle Henry?

You spoke of the Robertses in Colorado. I have cousins, Welle and Leo Ryan at Plateau City and two nieces, Mrs Mary Hayer and Mrs. Laura Thomson at Denver. Nelle and Leo wrote to me that your father visited them at Plateau City once a good many years ago.

Will you please send the date of your father's death? I take it that your mother is still living. Does she live at Montrose? She is eighty-three, a fine old age. Please give her my love.

Thanks for wishing me success with this undertaking. In the first five of the Locey families to be completed, I have listed 539 names. When all are in I imagine we will have nearly 900, - what a family.

And last thanks for the offer still more. Have the younger members all set down and the sheets returned as soon as possible, for I am very anxious to get the sets out now to all the families.

#### CARE OF THE RECORDS

We hope you will want to keep these records for your children, and porhaps their children. They should be kept in a loose-leaf binder such as is sold in any high school or college supply store. The best binder is an all leather binder with zipper all around, which costs about \$3.00. The plain cloth binders are inexpensive and very satisfactory.

#### OBLIGATION

This set comes to each of you with the compliments of my family and me. We are happy to get out this first set of 150 copies as partial recompense for the splendid help we have had from so many in getting the records to us. But in accepting this set, you accept it with a grave responsibility. You agree to help me keep a master copy accurate and up to date. That means, first that you will go ever these records of your family at once, and send to me corrections of errors and added records of every kind. It means, second, that you will send me a Christmas card or other card or letter at least once a year giving the names, dates, and places for every family change: marriages, deaths, new babies, and other interesting family items.

#### CORRECTION SHEET

As these changes and corrections reach me, I will enter them on my Master Copy, and at least once each year, I will try to get out a correction sheet so we may all bring our sets down to date.

#### THE GENERATIONS OF DANIEL AND PHOEBE LOCEY

This is the story my mother told to me:

"DANIEL LOCEY married PHOEBE ( ) in the north of Scotland, in some village near the Locey River, about 1750.

About 1763 or '4 they set sail for America on a sailing vessel. The trip took six weeks and small pox broke out on board. Both parents died, leaving five small children. PHOEBE was buried at sea and DANIEL was buried the day they landed.

Of the children, DESIRE was the oldest and DANIEL, the youngest. The others were NEHEMIAH, PHOEBE, and CATHERINE MARIA. The records of all but DANIEL have been lost. He married HESTER (ESTHER) TAYLOR in Sullivan County, New York, and became the father of sixteen children. One of his daughters was your grandmother.

Children: BRAZIL, NEHEMIAH, JOHN NEWKIRK, ALEXANDER THOMPSON, ABRAM TAYLOR, FRANCIS JANE, PHOEBE, DESIRE, CATHERINE MARIA, ELIZABETH ANN, BEULAH ANN, IRA HORTON, THOMAS PASON, MARIA CORNELIA. Four, including DESIRE and THOMAS PASON, died in infancy."

PHOEBE may have been named THOMPSON. The Lower river is doubtless the Lossie. HESTER TAYLOR may be ESTEFR, both spellings are in the record.

THIS IS THE STUFF OF WHICH THE WEST IS MADE

All of the children were born in Sullivan County, New York. Carlyle, Illinois, has been the family home since 1826. DANIEL and HESTER LOCEY died there in 1835. He was a brick mason and a stone mason and farmer. For more than a century the families of the children have been scattering out from Carlyle, - to Wisconsin, Iowa, Missouri, Kansas, Oklahoma, Colorado, Washington, Oregon, California.

The records which follow read like the first chapter of Matthew, and our grandfather and grandmother, DANIEL and HESTER, seem to have taken seriously the admonition of the Lord after the waters had receded from Ararat, an admonition not wholly lost upon the succeding generations.

Since these family names appear over and over again in these records, some sort of key seemed necessary. Every person in the direct relationship has been given a letter and a number. The number denotes the place in the family and the letter indicates the generation in America, as follows:

BRAZEL LOSEY 1796-1797 1830-1837

BRAZEL LOSEY, first child of Daniel and Hester Taylor Losey, was born in 1796 or 1797, near Bloomingburg, Sullivan County, New York, where he grew up. He preceded his parents westward, marrying in Ohio, living in Carlyle, Illinois before the arrival of the family of his parents, and returning to Ohio, where he died between 1830 and 1837.

The following account is taken from records sent by Mollie  $F_{\bullet}$  Fitzgerrell of Carlyle:

BRAZIL (BRAZEL) LOSEY married Mary Shepherd in Reading, Ohio, June 20, 1820. Mary Shepherd was born April 28, 1798 died October 4, 1837 (Record from Mrs. Christian Howard of Sharronville, Ohio, a relative of Mary Shepherd). Brazil may have gone to relatives in Ohio before coming to Carlyle. Evidently he preceded his father. It is said he was a stage driver. Brazil Locey is given in Clinton County, Illinois census of 1825 in Gunridge precinct; in 1826 he was appointed trustee for four years of school lands in T.1, N.3 W-16' Section.

He had a grocery store at northwest corner of public square in Carlyle. He was bitten by mad dog and after two years, having spasms, his wife insisted upon going back to Ohio where he died.

Brazil and wife had two sons and one daughter. One son, Samuel Losey, lived near Lawrence, Kansas, died at the age of 72 years, had a son Mon, and daughter Grace. A grandson of Brazil, T.J. Losey lived in 1912 at Los Angeles, California. He was reared in Ohio among the Shakers, knew very little of his parents; his father may have been the brother to Samuel. A son of T.J. Locey was an attorney in Chickasha, Oklahoma in 1912, name Thomas B. Losey.

NEHEMIAH LOCEY, second child of Daniel and Hester Taylor Locey, was born March 24, 1799 near Bloomingburg, Sullivan County, New York, died October 15, 1880, at Alleghany, Sierra County, California, and is buried at Camptonville, once a mining community in the mother lode country, now a ghost town. Nehemiah Locey, called "Meyer" was one of the earliest teachers in Clinton County, Illinois. He was a 49er, and after the mining excitement passed, he continued to live in the mountain country, finally passing away at the age of 81 years. Records indicate that he was married three times, -- first wife, ELIZABETH HINES in New York, second ------ WATTS, and third, name not recorded. Three children, Frances Ellen, and Thomas Daniel, the records of whose families are here given, and a son of the third wife who died at an early age whose records are lost.
