Cherry in the said State, who being by me first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war." That he the said Reuben Hall enlisted in the month of March 1777 in the State of

in the company commanded by Captain Amos Emerson of the Regiment commanded by Col. Joseph Billig of the New Hampshire Line, on the Continental establishment; that he continued to serve in the said corps, or in the service of the United States, until the expiration of three years — the term of his enlistment, when he was discharged from service in

but he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services, excepting the discharge unto aforesaid, sworn to and declared before me, the day and year aforesaid.

STATE OF NEW-HAMPSHIRE.

ROCKINGHAM....SS.

ON this eleventh day of July - 1820, personally appeared before the Hon<sup>ble</sup> John Harvey and Willm Burgen Esqrs. Justices of the Court of Common Pleas for the said County of Rockingham, being a Court of Record for the said County of Rockingham, having the power of fine and imprisonment, Newbur<sup>n</sup> Hall aged sixty four years, resident in Chester, in said county, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows:— In March 1777 I enlisted in Captain Amos Emerson's company in Colonial Billy's Regiment in the New Hampshire Line for three years until the cessation of that war I received an honorable discharge. The date of my original declaration in order to obtain a pension is the 17<sup>th</sup> day of April 1818. The number of my pension certificate is 11,099. I have received a pension.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of March, 1818; and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale or in any manner, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it, as to bring myself within the provision of an Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War," passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts or debts, due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed. My occupation is that of a labourer in agriculture but in consequence of age and a disease in my feet I am sometimes unable to perform any labour but at other times I am able to do this in family residing with me half of a man's work. I have one daughter with me who is able to support herself which is all the family I have. Their capacity to contribute to their support
